



ADDITIONAL SELECTED POST 76 MEMBER ACTIVITIES




RULES FOR SALUTING THE FLAG

What is the proper thing to do when the flag is passing in a parade or during the playing of the national anthem. Should you stand or salute? Are women required to remove their hats? Can you salute if you're not in uniform?

Conduct During the Passing of Colors

Here is the wording of 4 U.S. Code § 9 "Conduct during hoisting, lowering or passing of flag"



Conduct During the National Anthem

Here is the wording of 36 U.S. Code § 301 "National anthem"

- (a) Designation.—The composition consisting of the words and music known as the Star-Spangled Banner is the national anthem.
- (b) Conduct During Playing.—During a rendition of the national anthem—
 - (1) when the flag is displayed—
 - (A) individuals in uniform should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note;
 - (B) members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute in the manner provided for individuals in uniform; and
 - (C) all other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, and men not in uniform, if applicable, should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart; and
 - (2) when the flag is not displayed, all present should face toward the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed.

IMPORTANT NOTE! Nellis Air Force Base is moving up its Aviation Nation show from its traditional November dates to April. The free air show is now scheduled for <u>6 and 7 April 2025</u>.

ARE YOU RECEIVING EMAIL FROM POST 76?

A recent change in how mass emails are handled by most receiving email service providers has impacted how mail sent by us is delivered to you. As a result, we needed to change our free email delivery service.

We do not have valid email addresses for many of our members. It could be transcription typos because the area on the application is so small to handwrite the address, or you have chosen not to provide us with one on your renewals. We only have email addresses from about 500 of our over 1000 members on our roster. Whereas we only had a few that were rejected in 2022, this year, we have had 75 that "bounced", either because the address was invalid or the mailbox was full.

In the next few months, our Chaplain will be making "buddy check" calls, the purpose of which is just to check on your well being, **not to solicit anything else**. If he could check to see if you have a valid email address, that would help us immensely keep in touch with you. Otherwise, if you did not receive any email recently from us, send us an email to **NVPost76@gmail.com**. We promise that the number of emails per month will be three or less, not spam or sales but information on meetings, important veteran information, or special events.
