Currently, there are four active campaigns:

- H.R. 1004 & S. 410 Love Lives On Act of 2025.
 - Senators Cortez-Masto, & Rosen, along with Representatives Horsford, Lee, & Titus are co-sponsors.
- H.R. 1423 & S. 649 GI Bill Parity Act of 2025.
 - No Nevada Legislator has co-sponsored.
- H.R. 2102 & S. 1032 Major Richard Star Act of 2025.
 - Senators Cortez-Masto, & Rosen, along with Representatives Horsford, Lee, & Titus are co-sponsors.
- H.R. 3151 & S. 1536 SHIPS for America Act of 2025.
 - No Nevada Legislator has co-sponsored.

Please go to the Grassroots Action center to generate an email to your legislators and encourage them to co-sponsor these bills.

On May 19, the following bills passed in the House via voice vote, and have moved on to the Senate:

- H.R. 217 CHIP IN for Veterans Act of 2025.
- H.R. 1147 Veterans Accessibility Advisory Committee Act of 2025.
- H.R. 1286 The Simplifying Forms for Veterans Claims Act.
- H.R. 1364 The Automotive Support Services to Improve Safe Transportation Act of 2025.
- H.R. 1587 Veterans Claims Education Act of 2025.
- H.R. 1815 The VA Home Loan Program Reform Act.
- H.R. 1823 VA Budget Shortfall Accountability Act.
- H.R. 2201 The Improving VA Training for Military Sexual Trauma Claims Act.

At the state level, we are following:

- A.B. 145 This bill revises provisions relating to veterans. (BDR 37-77)
 - Senators Michelee Cruz-Crawford, & Roberta Lange, along with Assemblymembers Ken Gray, & Reuben D'Silva are sponsors.

A.B. 145 has not received a vote. The bi-annual legislative session ends on June 2, 2025.

Please contact your Nevada Assemblyperson and ask them to vote for this bill.

ANOTHER FORGOTTEN HOLIDAY

Welcome to June! June brings us Flag Day, on the 14th of June. It is a day to proudly display the flag – although most members of the American Legion Auxiliary think any day is a proud day to display the American flag.

Does your Unit or Post have a commemoration ceremony for Flag Day? Many do not. At some Posts, this is the day set aside for the proper disposal of unserviceable American flags – those that are faded, ripped, or torn. They are placed in a burn barrel, and burned in a respectful way. Some Units and Posts remember the date in 1777 when the United States approved the design for the first American flag with patriotic songs, readings, and maybe a picnic.

Why is this holiday so rarely observed? It is not a Federal Holiday; government buildings don't close for Flag Day. Even stores rarely run "Flag Day" sales, as they seem to do with every other holiday – whether appropriate or not.

Out here in the Western United States, one reason Flag Day is not generally observed is because the school year is already finished. On the East Coast, where public school generally starts right after Labor Day in September and finishes the third week of June, Flag Day is the last assembly of the year. Schoolchildren gather around the main school flag pole, salute the flag, sing flag songs (does anyone know "There are Many Flags in Many Lands" song besides me?), discuss the Betsy Ross "story" of the first flag, and make their own paper American flags in class. Older children may learn about flag etiquette, something the American Legion Auxiliary teaches in many schools. But here in Nevada, school is over, and so is the opportunity to teach schoolchildren about this Holiday.

As members of the American Legion Auxiliary, let's not forget Flag Day 2025.
