HONORING AMERICAN HEROES WORLDWIDE

Memorial Day in the United States is the day in which our nation annually remembers and honors those men and women who have died in our nation's wars. But, ceremonies to pay respects to our fallen comrades-in-arms is not limited to the US. Post 76 Legionnaire Stephen Daugherty recently had the privilege to participate in such a service in Taipei, Taiwan.

Background: During the period of 1944–1945, Allied airmen who had been shot down or crashed while on patrols over Taiwan were held as POWs in the Taipei prison by the Japanese Army. Thousands of Allied soldiers were also imprisoned in other POW camps around the island. On 29 May 1945, 14 American airmen from the POW prison in Taipei were given a "mock trial" and sentenced to death. The execution took place inside the prison courtyard only 58 days before the end of World War II. When the war ended, the rest of the men were released and returned home.

The plight of these warriors could have been lost in history. But, many years later, a single individual, Michael Hurst, a Canadian citizen now

living in Taiwan, formed the Taiwan POW Camps Memorial Society and began to document the POW camp locations and prisoners held within. He managed to cut through red tape barriers and erect plaques to officially memorialize the allied soldiers and airmen held in the camps in many locations.

One such plaque recognizes the 14 US airmen above (See Figure 1, 2). The inscription reads in part: "This plaque is placed here in honor and memory of all the allied airmen who were held in the former Taipei Prison by the Japanese Army in 1944-45, and the fourteen American airmen who were needlessly executed here on June 19, 1945." This location is named "The Taipei Prison Wall" and is the site for annual Service of Remembrance ceremonies, co-sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 9957 and the Taiwan POW Camps Memorial Society.

On 18 June 2023, a Service of Remembrance to honor the 14 American airmen who were needlessly executed was held at the Taipei Prison Wall plaque. Tributes were brought from Lt. Gen. Chang, Huey-Zon (Ret), former Deputy Commander of the Taiwan Air Force; Michael Hurst, POW Camp Memorial Society; and Felix Wang, Taiwan Veterans

Affairs Council (See Figure 3) and others. The names of the 25 interned American airmen were read, messages (See Figure 4) from various members, and a prayer were shared. Finally, wreaths were laid, Taps played, a minutes' silence, Reveille, and a final solemn salute to the fallen airmen (See Figure 5) close the program.

It was another scorcher for The Summerlin Council Patriotic Parade. The Patriotic Parade drew an estimated 50,000 people, who sat alongside streets of The Trails Village, to witness 70 entries march down nearly a mile. The council says over 2,500 people were in the parade, 500 volunteers supported the operations, and 20,000 cubic feet of helium kept 20 giant balloons in the air.

The American Legion NV Post 76 "Spirit of Freedom", and our chartered Scout troops and Pack marched and showed the Post and Troop colors and patriotism of our members and scouts. Our Post is the 2nd largest in NV, largest not serving alcohol and focuses on service to veterans, service members and communities. Our chartered Scout Troops 312 include a young man's and young women's troops. In addition we charter a Cub Pack. The Cubs showed unbelievable stamina as they marched the almost 1 mile (the last 2/3rds up hill) in the stifling heat.

We have "been there, done that". As such, Legionnaires understand sacrifice and they know well the

hardships that accompany military service. The men and women of The American Legion stand ready to assist our nation's newest veterans and their families engaged in the Global War on Terror.

In voting that took place for weeks after the parade, enough of you were diligent in voting for our entry so the Winner of 1st Place in the Resident Choice Award 2023 was American Legion Post 76 "Spirit of Freedom"/Boys and Girls of Troop 312 and Pack 312!

A recent change in how mass emails are handled by most receiving email service providers has impacted how mail sent by us is delivered to you. As a result, we needed to change our free email delivery service.

We do not have valid email addresses for many of our members. It could be transcription typos because the area on the application is so small to handwrite the address, or you have chosen not to provide us with one on your renewals. We only have email addresses from about 500 of our over 1000 members on our roster. Whereas we only had a few that were rejected in 2022, this year, we have had 75 that "bounced", either because the address was invalid or the mailbox was full.

In the next few months, our Chaplain will be making "buddy check" calls, the purpose of which is just to check on your well being, **not to solicit anything else**. If he could check to see if you have a valid email address, that would help us immensely keep in touch with you. We promise that the number of emails per month will be three or less, not spam or sales but information on meetings, important veteran information, or special events.

The BSA Las Vegas Area Council in association with sponsor Safari Club International put on a "**Shooting Sports Day**" event on August 26, 2023. The event was held at the Pro Gun Vegas gun club near Boulder City.

Post 76 Legionnaire members Steve Bickford and Pete Cervantes were there to help sixteen Scouts earn their Rifle Shooting Merit Badges.





Steve led the classroom discussion

with Pete's assistance. There were plenty of "Show 'N Tell" items to go along with what was being said.

A heavy emphasis was on safe gun handling along with learning about different rifle types and how to use & clean them.

Afterwards Pete took the Scouts to the range to put into practice what they learned in the classroom. All Scouts were using .22 LR Bolt Action Rifles.

The main take away from the class was ... Safety, Safety, and Safety.

Remember these THREE fundamental NRA rules for safe gun handling.

- 1. ALWAYS keep the gun pointed in a safe direction.
- 2. ALWAYS keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.
- 3. ALWAYS keep the gun unloaded until ready to use.

EXPLANATION OF AMERICAN LEGION MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership in The American Legion is based on a <u>calendar-year from 1 January to 31 December</u>
IF as of 1 January 2024 you have not paid, <u>you will be considered expired</u>. If you have not already paid your 2024 dues, by paying your dues now, you help our Post have the resources to support programs that benefit both veterans and families in our area. If your membership card says 2024, you are current.
Our Fiscal Year is July—June of each year. If you have not renewed, You MAY continue to receive notices to "please renew for Fiscal Year 2024". <u>If you have already renewed and receive a notice, ignore it</u>.
