How you can help 'Be The One'?

The American Legion recently launched its <u>Be The One campaign</u> to encourage American Legion Family members, veterans, servicemembers and others to take action when they believe a veteran is at risk of suicide.

Here are some answers to common questions about this new initiative:

Question: How did the "Be The One" initiative develop?

Answer: The American Legion, the nation's largest veterans service organization with more than 1.8 million members, is guided by its Four Pillars. Among those is the Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation pillar. At its core, the Legion's mission is to enhance the well-being of America's veterans, their families, our military and our communities by their devotion to mutual helpfulness.

Question: Why is this a priority right now?

Answer: Today, the No. 1 issue facing those who served is veteran suicide, according to the <u>National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report.</u> Each day, no fewer than 17 veterans die by suicide. That's more than 6,000 each year. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults. As the Global War on Terrorism continues, there will be more veterans facing mental-health issues such as post-traumatic stress disorder.

Question: What will the Be The One campaign achieve?

Answer: At its core, The American Legion is activating a national platform to end veteran suicide. The Be the One campaign will:

- Destigmatize asking for mental health support, creating opportunity for those with mental health issues to speak freely and get the support they need.
- · Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in local communities.
- Deploy FDA-approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support.

Question: I'm not a veteran. How can I support this program?

Answer: The stigma associated with mental health issues is a barrier to veterans seeking assistance. They fear loss of their job, think they can handle their situation themselves, or don't think others can understand their situation. Family members may be the first to recognize the signs that their loved one needs help, but they may lack the knowledge of how to approach the situation. If you have a family member who is a veteran, The American Legion encourages you to Be the One to:

- · Ask veterans in your life how they are doing.
- · Listen when a veteran needs to talk.
- Reach out when a veteran is struggling.
- Pledge to Be the One at betheone.org by signing up for email updates.

Question: I'm a veteran. What should I do to help this program succeed?

Answer: While this program is designed to help all veterans, we know that everyone responds differently to stresses, have different life experiences and have varying results in types of treatment. However, the following are guidelines intended to provide help before a crisis situation develops. The American Legion encourages you to Be the One to:

- Talk with others about how you are feeling.
- Ask for help when you know you need it.
- Know there are millions of people ready to help you.
- Remember your family and friend's care.

ALL VETERANS TO BENEFIT FROM NEW ACT SIGNED INTO LAW, WILL GET FREE LIFETIME ACCESS TO NATIONAL PARKS

An act signed into law gives all veterans and Gold Star families free lifetime access to National Parks.

The act was part of the defense authorization bill which was signed into law.

"When you take your oath, if you go into the service, to protect and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic, you really are protecting the homeland," stated the National Park Service's new director Chuck Sams. "I think this is a great recognition of that responsibility you took on to serve your nation."

Back in 2020, the Department of Interior announced that veterans and Gold Star families would get free access to national parks and other public lands, but this law makes it permanent.

Many popular destinations, such as the Grand Canyon National Park and Yellowstone National Park, can now be visited by veterans for no cost.

In order to use the benefit veterans will need to present a form of valid identification, which may include:

DoD ID card Veteran Health Identification card Veteran ID card State-issued card displaying veteran status

THE AMERICAN LEGION HAILS SENATE, 117TH CONGRESS FOR 'HISTORIC BIPARTISAN ACHIEVEMENT' ON PACT ACT

WASHINGTON (June 16, 2022) – The head of the nation's largest veterans organization praised the Senate for its passage of legislation that will provide comprehensive benefits to veterans suffering from conditions linked to toxic exposure during their time in the U.S. Armed Forces.

"Today, the U.S. Senate has saved lives and truly delivered for veterans," American Legion National Commander Paul E. Dillard said. "By passing the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our PACT Act, the 117th Congress has put substance behind the phrase, 'Thank you for your service.' The American Legion is grateful for the service of millions of veterans who were exposed to burn pits, atomic radiation, Agent Orange and other environmental poisons. Thanks to the U.S. Congress, these men and women will be able to receive the care and benefits they have earned. The PACT Act is an historic bipartisan achievement. The American Legion thanks not only those who voted for this legislation but the thousands of Legionnaires and advocates who worked to make this happen. We look forward to President Biden signing the Honoring Our PACT Act into law."

The Honoring Our PACT Act, which had already passed in the House of Representatives, will provide health care for millions of veterans who were exposed to contaminants emanating from open-air burn pits. It establishes presumptions of service connection for 23 respiratory illnesses and cancers linked to burn pits and other hazards. It will also provide additional resources and staff to the Department of Veterans Affairs.
