Service Officer's Message – VA Voluntary Services Needs YOU

The VA Voluntary Services for the Southern Nevada Healthcare System <u>URGENTLY</u> needs **OUR help!** There are openings at all locations for volunteers and donations to meet the needs of OUR Veteran patients. A list of needs was sent recently via email, and copies will be available at

the next meeting. If YOU can help in any way, contact OUR VAVS representative, *Trustee Jack Ford* (702) 493-2252 or YOUR *Service Officer Frank Timbers* (702) 228-0889. Be sure to mention YOU are with American Legion Post 76 and want to help!

The Post needs YOU to take an active role in OUR future as a recruiter by talking to YOUR friends, relatives, and people whom YOU sit next to that may be wearing something that says, "I am a Veteran". Do they belong? Do they know what the American Legion does? Are they are aware of the benefits they could have as a Legionnaire? If they do not, then ask them to come to a meeting and join YOU.

What is a Veteran to the Legion? It is any military person who has honorably served his/her country during periods of military conflict. It doesn't matter if he/she was involved in WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Gulf War, Iraq or Afghanistan or anywhere in the Global War on Terrorism. All vets treated as equals in the eyes of the Legion. We leave OUR rank when we leave the active duty military.

What is the process for recruiting new members? YOU can use the application on the back of this newsletter by having them fill out the simple form, provide a copy of their DD214, which can be given or sent to the Adjutant or 1<sup>st</sup> Vice who will make sure that the rest of the process is in motion. We can supply YOU with as many application forms as YOU need.

So when YOU spot a person with a military insignia hat or shirt, and they appear to be at that ready age (55+), invite them to join. Although is a primary responsibility of the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Commander Mike Percival, he needs YOU to help him keep OUR numbers where we need them to best stay "Veterans Still Serving America".

These activities continue to form the basis for the community's view of what veterans are and what veterans do. We give.

So, YOU make up YOUR mind to get involved. Call any Post officer or better yet, come to a general Post 76 membership meeting the 3rd Sunday of the month at the Durango Hills YMCA. We need YOU and YOUR community needs YOU. The American Legion, Veterans Still Serving America.

YOUR Donations to Post 76 are Tax Deductible — As per IRS Publication 557, Post 76 is a tax-exempt 501(c)(19) Veterans' Organization under Group Exemption Number (GEN) 0925. Donations to war veterans' organizations are deductible as charitable contributions on the donor's federal income tax return. At least 90% of the organization's membership must consist of war veterans. The term war veterans means persons, whether or not present members of the U.S. Armed Forces, who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces during a period of war (including the Korean and Vietnam conflicts, the Persian Gulf War, and The Global War on Terror).

Show YOUR Pride in Serving and Get the Recognition from a Grateful Nation — The coming months will also present

the opportunity for veterans to stand and be seen in several memorial activities and parades. If YOU are able — join us. The community is looking to show its support for what YOU have done and need YOU there for them to be able to show it. YOU are able to stand, side by side, with YOUR fellow Post 76 members and show the pride YOU have in YOUR service to YOUR country. Post 76 is entering the Summerlin Patriotic Parade on Thursday, July 4, 2014. This is the only 4th of July Parade in Las Vegas. We have a number of slots still available to ride in the Model Ts provided by the Las Vegas Model T Club. Later in the year, we participate in the Veteran's Day Parade in downtown Las Vegas, November 11th, 2013, 10:00 AM. More information will be provided to those that notify us they want to attend either or both parades.

Join us to attend "No Veteran Alone" Funerals — Thirtythousand, that is 30,000 of OUR comrades, who, like YOU were proud to wear the uniform of the U.S. Military are laid to rest at the Southern Nevada Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Boulder City. Nearly every Thursday morning, members of YOUR Nevada Post 76, The Nevada Patriot Guard, Women Veterans of Nevada, The Vietnam Veterans of America, as well as other Veteran organizations, pay tribute to Veterans who have no family members to accompany them on the journey to their final resting place. Come and join us, if YOU have a Flag, bring it. We even have members attend in wheelchairs and scooters. Be part of YOUR Post Color Guard to honor these brave men and women.
