FREE LIFETIME NATIONAL PARKS PASSES

All U.S. veterans and Gold Star family members will be able to get a free lifetime entrance pass for federal parks and recreation sites nationwide starting Nov. 11.

The pass, an expansion on the annual free pass for currently serving troops and their families, grants free access to about 2,000 parks and lands managed by the National Park Service; U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service; U.S. Forest Service; Bureau of Land Management; Bureau of Reclamation; and the U.S. <u>Army</u> Corps of Engineers, according to an announcement on the park service website. It also gives discounted amenity fees in some locations.

While not every park or visitor area requires an entrance fee, many do. For example, Yosemite National Park in California charges a \$35



entrance fee per vehicle, while Craters of the Moon National Monument charges \$20. Other locations charge for entering museum or curation areas in the visitor center. For instance, the Begich, Boggs Visitor Center in the Chugach National Forest, Alaska, charges \$5 per adult to access a film and exhibits.

Those fees are waived for holders of the new lifetime pass, as well as those with the free active-duty America the Beautiful military pass or other passes sold or awarded by the agencies. The new pass covers the holder and any accompanying passengers in a private vehicle at sites that charge per car, or the pass owners and up to three adults age 16 and over at sites that charge per person.

The new lifetime pass program does not exclude veterans with so-called "bad paper" discharges. To get the pass, veterans must submit one of the following:

- Unexpired Department of Defense Identification Card (DD Form 2, DD Form 2765, or Next Generation USID replacement)
- Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC)
- Veteran ID Card

Veteran designation on a state-issued U.S. driver's license or identification card

To receive a pass visit a National Parks or parks and land agency store or staffed fee kiosk, or order via the <u>U.S. Geological</u> <u>Survey store</u>. Passes ordered online carry a \$10 processing and shipping fee. Passes received in-person are free.

Gold Star family members can receive the pass by presenting a self-verification form certifying they are the next of kin to a military member killed during service overseas. The form includes a signature block and confirmation that the user is an "eligible next of kin (NOK) of a member of the United States Armed Forces who lost his or her life in qualifying situation."

No other identification or proof is required for Gold Star family members who want to get a lifetime pass.



NEW VA WHOLE LIFE INSURANCE AVAILABLE

In January 2023, VA will launch a new life insurance program called Veterans Affairs Life Insurance (VALife), which provides guaranteed acceptance whole life insurance coverage to Veterans age 80 and under, with any level of service-connected disability. Some Veterans age 81 and older may also be eligible.

Guaranteed acceptance is a whole life policy that does not require a medical exam or ask health questions. It also does not have a limited two-year window to sign up. Whole life insurance provides coverage for the entire life of the individual policyholder, provided that premiums are always paid. Premium rates are locked in for the life of the policy, and unlike term policies will not increase as the policyholder ages.



Veterans age 80 or younger with a VA disability rating of 0-100% are eligible for VALife, with no time limit to apply.



Fellow Legionnaire Steve Bickford was a co-instructor for a NRA Basic Firearm Safety Course held at the local BSA Las Vegas Area Council HQ on August 13, 2022. The four-hour class covered safe handling and storage for pistols, rifles, and shotguns.

While no live ammunition was present a variety of firearms were available to go over functionality with respect to safely and operation. These and other firearm related classes are offered by the Silver State Shooting Sports Association organization in conjunction with the LVAC BSA Shooting Sports Committee, which Steve is a member.

Legionnaire Bickford volunteered for 2 scouting events.

The *first one was during "Scout Expo*" where he was teaching a merit badge class in Geocaching. Despite the strong winds that blew across the lake every hour or so 10 scouts managed to receive credit towards the merit badge. Two scouts went on a geocache hunt featuring six caches that were hidden around Floyd Lamb Park, with one scout actually putting his hand on the hidden cache saying he just cannot find it.

The *second scouting event was held at BSA Las Vegas Area Council HQ*, where legionnaire Bickford earned Rangemaster qualification for Cub Scouts. Helping the scouts learn safe range protocols for BB gun, Archery, and Sling Shot events. Approximately 50 Cub Scouts participated in the three events earning special awards to be placed on their uniforms. The Sling Shot event consisted of Wrist Rocket Sling Shots using dog kibbles for ammo resulting in easy cleanup and leftover food for the wildlife.

THE PACT ACT AND YOUR VA BENEFITS

The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.

The PACT Act adds to the list of health conditions that we assume (or "presume") are caused by exposure to these substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their <u>survivors</u>—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.

This page will help answer your questions about what the PACT Act means for you or your loved ones. You can also call us at <u>800-698-2411 (TTY: 711)</u>. And you can file a claim for PACT Act-related disability compensation or apply for VA health care now.

The PACT Act will bring these changes:

- → Expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and post-9/11 eras
- ★ Adds 20+ more presumptive conditions for burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic exposures
- ◆ Adds more presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation
- ★ Requires VA to provide a toxic exposure screening to every Veteran enrolled in VA health care

Helps us improve research, staff education, and treatment related to toxic exposures

If you're a Veteran or survivor, you can file claims now to apply for PACT Act-related benefits.
