A hundred years of service! To God, Country and Community. What a wonderful and amazing record of accomplishment for America’s largest veterans’ organization. For those who served in the mud-filled trenches of WWI, the steaming jungles of WWII and Viet Nam, the frozen ridges of Korea, and the burning sands of the Gulf and Middle East, The American Legion has fought long and hard for our returning veterans. Our success has been because of our strong, loud, and persistent voice to our elected Representatives, who listen and act because our voice is our membership.

Lately that voice which has resonated so loudly in the halls of Congress over the years has started to weaken and falter. If we intend for The American Legion to still be there 100 years from now, serving our future generations of veterans, each and every one of us must work to strengthen our membership voice. The Department of Nevada is running behind last year-s membership totals, and we are clearly not even coming near our full potential. Our goal of 7389 should be a breeze, without much effort. To put our failure in perspective, Clark County alone has 146,394 veterans as of 2017. Males constitute 91% and female veterans the other 9%. You do not have to be a math major to see how badly we are under-performing in our recruitment efforts.

I am asking each of you who reads this article to take action immediately to “Just Ask” everyone you meet if they are a veteran, and if they served during a wartime period if they belong to The American Legion. If they are eligible for membership you can put them in touch with their nearest Post or the Department Office at 702-382-2353. And don’t forget that if they are not a veteran, but are related to a veteran, they may be eligible for our Auxiliary or Sons of the Legion. Please do your part today and every day to keep our Legion voice resonating and powerful. And remember to always carry a membership application with you.

Also we must not forget that Retention is as important as Recruitment. If you haven’t seen or heard from a friend or member of your Post in awhile, reach out to them and ask them to join you in an upcoming event or meeting. TALARC—THE AMERICAN LEGION AMATEUR RADIO CLUB



The American Legion has formed a special entity to provide a forum for military veterans who today are engaged in a hobby that can also provide emergency communications "when all else fails." There are estimated to be 700,000 federally licensed amateur radio operators, or "hams," in the United States. Over the years, countless members of the U.S. military were trained as technicians or engineers, and later obtained amateur-radio licenses to continue to use their abilities at home, as both recreation and a public-service commitment.

"Since 2011, The American Legion's amateur radio club board members have conducted monthly nets from within or near the National Headquarters city of Indianapolis, joined by volunteer TALARC net control operators hosting nets from their homes and post radio stations across the nation. Like all nets, our purpose is to provide a chance for all members to get "on the air," and to experience the use of different communications modes. In addition to typical HF operations, nets using other modes were established to accommodate newly minted hams who may be limited by equipment or licensing privileges. As a bonus, over the years we've added many hams who have come across our nets and learned about the existence of our great and growing program.

POST 76 CHARTERS SCOUT PACK AND TWO SCOUT TROOPS



The adventure starts with Cub Scouting, a year-round family program designed for boys in the 1st through 5th grades, or 7 to 10 years of age. The program emphasizes shared leadership, learning about the community, family understanding, character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness. Cub Scout Pack 312 fills this function in our area.

Scouting BSA then takes over as the traditional Scouting experience for youth in the fifth grade through high school. Service, community engagement and leadership development become increasingly important parts of the program as youth lead their own activities and work their way toward earning Scouting's highest rank, Eagle Scout.

Scouting BSA has a lot to offer, but our scouts don't let the number of merit badges scare them away. With exposure to a uniquely hands-on learning experience and the opportunity to earn merit badges reflecting each Scout's budding interests, youth unlock a world of discovery around them and forge a path for the future. POST 76 SERVICE OFFICER REQUEST

Our TFA (Temporary Financial Assistance) which intended for Veteran families that are in need of financial help that have minor children. It is a one time fund only for those that meet the requirements. With that said, let me turn to a recent correspondence I received from the National Commander Bret P. Reistad.

"We are in a crisis situationActive Duty service members are facing financial hardships and are turning to the American Legion for help in record numbers. Request for help through our Temporary Financial Assistance grants (TFA) are pouring in from U.S. Coast Guard personnel across the country affected by the government shutdown.

The annual operating budget for the TFA program is approximately \$300,000. As I write this letter, we have distributed over \$800,000 in assistance to Coast Guard families with minor children and there are hundreds of additional requests being processed. We are just a month into 2019 and have exhausted the entire TFA budget.

We do not want to have to turn away our comrades ... including the brave members of our Coast Guard ... who are risking their lives defending us daily. They should not have to worry about putting food on the table."

My fellow legionaries, when your request to help rebuild our TFA fund, please consider the need and give freely.

U.S. MINT AMERICAN LEGION 100TH ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATIVE COINS

The authorizing legislation for the American Legion 100th Anniversary Commemorative Coins also calls for the Mint to collect surcharges from coin sales—\$35 for each \$5 gold coin, \$10 for each silver dollar coin, and \$5 for each half dollar clad coin. The surcharges are authorized to be paid to the American Legion to support the Legion's programs for veterans, members of the Armed Forces, and other purposes specified by the authorizing legislation. The Mint announced on 14 March minting of these coins. Introductory pricing ends 15 April 3 PM EST. Check out Legion.org/coin. Directors shall be elected in a staggered order such that only one Director shall be elected each year. A Director shall be a member of the Finance Committee, and the Audit Committee and chair the Nominations Committee.
