MARK THE DATE! To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War, the US Secretary of Defense authorized a special recognition for all Veterans who served on active duty during the period <u>1 November 1955 to 15 May 1975.</u>

Your Post 76 will sponsor an award ceremony for all eligible Veterans to receive a specially designed lapel pin for this occasion to recognize, thank, and honor Veterans who served during the Vietnam War. The ceremony will be in conjunction with the Post 76 General meeting on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>20 May</u> and <u>Sunday</u>, <u>17 June</u> at the Durango Hills YMCA, 3521 N Durango Dr at 1330.

Prior to the ceremony, there were 3 of us in the parking lot, unloading our equipment. Two young children, ages of +/- 8 yrs-10 yrs old on bicycles. Both bicycles were both painted the same with highly visible yellow florescent paint. Another Legionnaire, Earl Stitts and myself walked over to the two young kids and started talking with them. PPC Joel Forman then walked up behind us. We were just glad to see them and their interest in us. Legionnaire Stitts asked them if they knew



the Pledge of Allegiance. They both said "yes". We told them if they would recite it we would salute (since we were all in full Legion uniform) while they gave the Pledge. They did and they were in awe while we stood at attention and saluted. After, we both told them what a great job they did and "manly" hand shakes were given to both. We were talking about what a great time that was to interact with those two kids.

We did not know the Coach for the school was watching us from the gymnasium door entrance. When we got to the door he stopped us. He told us what a great and honorable thing we had done with those two kids. He explained that he, the coach, could relate to what took place, since he was black just like the two young kids. He said that the neighborhood, and pointed to across the street, that they came from was extremely distressed. He was amazed that they would relate to Earl and myself since we are both white. He said the fact they even talked to us was unheard of. He said we could have made a huge difference in their minds as we did not care if they were black or white, to us they were and are just kids. We all commented on how much we wish more experiences like this could happen. We as Veterans know when the facts are known, color has no place, only friendship and respect for one another matters. MEMBERSHIP FACTOIDS

With the publication of this Newsletter, the beginning of the 2019 dues year, 1 July 2018, is not too far away. Membership dues are valid for the calendar year, for example, 1 January 2019-31 December 2019. However, National Headquarters begins to mail the invoices for the next calendar year on 1 July. So you will begin to receive invoices for the 2019 dues year after 1 July 2018. Everyone who pays their 2019 dues this early is considered an Early Bird, and you will a get pretty red bird stamped on your new Post 76 ID card. Be aware that your 2018 membership does not expire until 31 December 2018, but it helps everyone in the system if you pay early.

Speaking of membership expiration, there are still a few Post 76 members who have not paid their 2018 membership dues, so you're technically expired. However, National Headquarters has made a provision in membership policy such that an expired member can be reinstated if dues are paid before the next dues year's dues invoices are mailed—before 1 July 2018. So, get your 2016 dues paid!

And don't forget that there is always an unavoidable time delay from when you renew your membership online or by mail and when you actually get your renewal logged at Headquarters; so you may receive another dues invoice, even though you know you've paid. All Legionnaires who have renewed their membership receive a Welcome Letter from the Post 76 Commander with their new member ID Card. **This is your receipt for payment of dues, and you know you can ignore any subsequent dues invoices from HQ.**

Rest assured that your annual dues support very important Veterans causes. Your dues help advocate for Veterans issues at the congressional level and support programs in Las Vegas, Nevada, and across the nation. American Legion programs and services include: Troop Support, Child Welfare Foundation, Heroes to Hometowns, American Legion Baseball, Department Service Officers, Family Support Network, Flag Advocacy and Etiquette, Junior ROTC, Operation Comfort Warriors, Scholarships, Veterans Job Fairs, and many others. Thank you for ensuring that The American Legion remains the most powerful voice in America on behalf of veterans, service members, and their families. THE AMERICAN LEGION NATIONAL COLLEGE SEEKS CANDIDATES

The American Legion National Headquarters has sent applications for The American Legion National College to all Post Commanders & Adjutants. The date for this year's college is October 28th through November 2. Applicants will be accepted from war periods August 24,1982 through the present time. Once an applicant has been accepted by National from a Department to attend, that same De-

partment may send one (1) additional applicant from a previous war period. There is no cost to the applicant to attend the College. Department will pay the \$600.00 per applicant. Lodging and transportation to and from Indianapolis, IN are paid by National. Meals and other costs are the responsibility of the applicant. It is recommended that anyone seeking higher office in The American Legion consider applying to the College. You may contact the Post Commander or the Post Adjutant or me for the application or for additional information.

Post 76 was one of the first Posts in the Department to use the new Processing of Membership renewals and transfers. This should help to solve the issue of receiving renewal notices after you have paid by check. It will reduce processing time from 6-8 weeks to 5-9 days!

Being a member in good standing in The American Legion offers you FREE accidental life insurance. All you have to do is go to theLit.com, follow the easy instructions, and you will be covered for \$1000.00 accidental death, and \$5000.00 if you are on official American Legion business. Did I mention that it was absolutely free?

The membership in Post 76 has been increasing, and we are well past where we were last year! However, there is a large number of members in our Post who have allowed their membership to expire. We need you back so that the Post and The American Legion can help our Veterans.
