WHO ARE THE LIKELY RECRUITS TO THE LEGION?

What is a Veteran to the Legion? It is any military person who has honorably served his/her country during periods of military conflict. It doesn't matter if he/ she was involved in WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Gulf War, Iraq or Afghanistan. All vets treated as equals in the eyes of the Legion. We leave our rank when we leave the active duty military.

What age is our average Legionnaire? At least 55. We cannot expect a young 4year veteran to come home and join the legion when they have jobs and families to worry about. Even those who have retired from active duty service and are coming back home are still most likely seeking employment and may still have children at home.



Those of us who have "emptied the nest" and are "retired" from the 40-hour work week, are most likely going to be thinking about "serving their country, again."

So when you spot a person with a military insignia hat or shirt, and they appear to be at that ready age (55+), invite them to join. It is the best way to keep our numbers where we need them to best stay **"Veterans Still Serving America"**

Why Should They Belong?

The American Legion is the nation's largest and most powerful organization of U.S. wartime veterans and their families. Today, it counts 2.4 million members who operate through nearly 14,000 posts across the United States and beyond.

Since its inception by an act of Congress in 1919, The American Legion has delivered substantial improvements for veterans, families and communities. The Legion ushered in the modern VA. The Legion drafted and drove home passage of the GI Bill and the Post- 9/11 GI Bill. The Legion has brought into existence dozens of health-care benefits for veterans and programs designed to provide decent civilian careers after discharge.

The American Legion works every day on behalf of all U.S. servicemen and women. It is recognized as a national leader in transition assistance from military to civilian life, providing resources for careers, education opportunities, child care and more.

The Legion is active every day. Examples include: VA volunteers; American Legion Baseball; Junior Shooting Programs; and the National Emergency Fund. The Legion's services can be classified under the organization's four pillars: Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; and Children & Youth.

The Post needs YOU to step up and take an active role in

our future as a recruiter by talking to your friends, relatives, and people whom you sit next to that may be wearing something that says, "I am a Veteran". Here are some questions you can

ask them: Do they belong? Do they know what the American Legion does? Are they are aware of the benefits they could have as a Legionnaire? If they do not, then ask them to come to a meeting and join you.

How Can You Help?

What is the process for recruiting new members? For veterans who qualify (see back of enclosed application), there are multiple ways to join The American Legion. The traditional way is to fill out the simple form, which can be given or sent to the Adjutant or 1st Vice who will make sure that the rest of the process is in motion.

While online renewal is highly recommended for existing members because it reduces the turnaround time at all steps, online new membership is difficult because they join the general Legion, not our Post specifically.

Here is the recommended method for new members that can be done in a matter of minutes:

After a new member completes the application form, [see a copy on the back page] they can send it along with a check for \$35.00 to the Post PO Box address found on the first and last pages.

After that, the post adjutant will log his or her information and then transmit the form to the department headquarters. The department will forward the information to National Headquarters. At that time, the information will be logged into the national system.

If your recruit is a member of another Post and would like to join us, then the easiest way is to call or email either the Adjutant or 1st Vice. Transfers can be done over the telephone or email. The adjutant's telephone number is (702) 495-1795. The 1st Vice is (702) 534-1667. Their emails are NVPost76@gmail.com and mgpercival@gmail.com.
